

BRICK BAY WINES

Snells Beach, Warkworth

Though the building is nestled amongst quaint hills, the architecture of Brick Bay Wines, designed by award-winning architect Noel Lane in 2007, packs a contemporary punch. There are no overtones of Tuscan rusticity; instead a hothouse-like structure formed from Perspex and glass cantilevers out over a lake and rambling grounds.

The semi-transparent panel walls allow a tantalising glimpse of the on-site sculpture trail, while the coloured panels that distinguish the administration areas from the main service areas, glow like gemstones in the evening.
